Hello Collision Repair Program Participants,

I'm writing to let you know we're looking for new members to join the Collision Liaison Committee (Liaison Committee).

Collision Repair Program participants who are willing to volunteer their time and effort to help make continuous improvements to the Collision Repair Program are encouraged to consider representing industry.

Role of the Collision Liaison Committee

ICBC established the Collision Liaison Committee to provide a forum for discussing technical expertise, developing operational and program recommendations related to the collision repair of ICBC-insured vehicles. The Liaison Committee supports our objectives to:

- Manage the expectations of our shared customers
- Enable a culture of continual improvement and change
- Assess and resolve outstanding issues with our stakeholders

The scope of discussion at the Liaison Committee meetings are limited to:

- Operational issues that affect the delivery of automotive services
- Policy or procedural issues that impact the delivery of automotive services
- System or training requirements that arise from enhancements to ICBC systems or operations
- Any matter pertaining to a specific business relationship between ICBC and suppliers Please note, to comply with the *Competition Act*, we do not discuss compensation-related items at the Liaison Committee.

Time commitment

Representatives will participate for a term of at least 24 months and no more than 36 months, following which time a request for new representatives will be initiated. The Liaison Committee will meet in person, in the Lower Mainland for a half day, during business hours, on a quarterly

basis. Meeting attendance via MS Teams will always be available. Attendance at all meetings is

expected. New members will attend their first meeting in December 2025.

Participant selection and expressing interest

In selecting participants, we look for members who will represent the diverse geographic and

demographic needs of our facilities. Participants are selected for their expertise, ability to add

value to the committee, and contribution to agendas and discussion topics. Liaison Committee

members must be in good standing under ICBC's Collision Repair Program Guide.
